The agreed-upon procedures engagement compared CLS' controls documented in policies and procedures to applicable controls established by the International Organization Standardization (ISO) 27002 information security standard and ISO 27799 (*Health informatics – Information security management in health using ISO/IEC 27002*) standard. The agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. An independent firm performed the agreed-upon procedures by examining policies and procedures documenting controls and processes involved in storing, handling, and transmitting data securely. The successful completion of the voluntary review illustrates CLS' ongoing commitment to create and maintain the most stringent controls for the protection and security of its customers' confidential information. The agreed-upon procedures to review the controls establish by ISO was performed by an independent licensed Certified Public Accounting firm that specializes in conducting control reviews and audits. The independent firm examined CLS' controls related to 11 sections and 112 applicable controls specified by ISO 27002 and ISO 27799. Following the review, CLS received an Independent Accountant's Report on Applying Agreed-Upon Procedures Report with no exceptions, demonstrating that CLS' policies, procedures, and infrastructure for data protection, security, and confidentiality met or exceeded the stringent ISO standards.
